Harvest can also be combined with Forecast, a tool that visualizes where your project is going and how much of your budget remains. A week-by-week analysis lets you see how the tracked hours compares with the forecasted hours, so you can make better scheduling decisions.

Hubstaff: Best for Managing Remote Teams

One of the biggest challenges of managing a remote team is keeping tabs on each member's work and productivity. Hubstaff not only solves this problem with its comprehensive employee tracking tools; it also comes with an automated payroll software that dishes out payments according to time tracked.

Its main feature is the timesheet app, which captures how much time each team member is spending on a particular task or project, and how their progress is. You can set deadlines and time caps on each project to make sure the team gets their priorities straight. If you really want to make sure each person is spending their time productively, you can activate the employee monitoring feature, which takes automatic screenshots, tracks keyboard and mouse usage, and which websites they are visiting during work hours.

Hubstaff includes pay rates within the time sheet, and automatically pays each team member according to their hourly rate and time worked. This set-it-and-forget-it feature saves business owners the time and effort normally spent on billing and payments.

It is also worth noting that Hubstaff has native Mac, Windows, Linux, and iOS apps, allowing you to track your team using their preferred platform.

TimelyApp: Best for Visualising Project Timelines

TimelyApp proves that time tracking and project management does not have to literally be a black-and-white thing. This well-designed web application organises tasks and projects into a beautiful calendar, allowing you and your team members to map work in blocks of time and schedule their day more effectively.

Keeping with the calendar-like interface is TimelyApp's integration with Gmail, Google Calendar, and Office 365. As soon as you've hooked it up with these tools, meetings, workshops, and other calendar events automatically get imported into your day. With this, you can check your schedule at a glance and see if you can accommodate a new deadline or two.

Besides tracking your team's work, TimelyApp lets you tag each activity or project phase so you can stay on top of your progress. And with the new Memory feature, everything you've ever worked on for that day - including emails sent - gets logged into a stunning timeline. You'll never forget a single thing you've worked on, and you get a complete picture of all the billable hours your team worked on.

Toggl: Best for Simple Time Tracking and Project Management

You've probably heard of Toggl from their free Pomodoro Chrome extension, which also works as a time tracking and reporting tool. If you liked their Pomodoro timer, you're probably going to enjoy using their full-featured time tracker.

There are good reasons why Toggl is used by individuals and businesses alike. With mobile and desktop versions, over 80 integrations, and a simple interface, your use of Toggl can be as simple or complex as your needs.

Their web interface contains everything it has to offer, from project dashboards to team management. The main focus, however, is the ability to start and stop time tracking with no

fuss. The great thing about Toggl its multi-platform experience; you can start the timer on your desktop, work offline, and end it on a different device. Your tracked time can then be converted into billable weekly reports, which makes invoicing clients a breeze.

Hours: Best for iOS Time Tracking

Very rarely is a time tracking app designed for a single OS, but this narrow focus on iOS devices is part of what makes Hours a huge success. Designed by award-winning indie developer Tapity, Hours is a very simple way to get started with time tracking, whether it's for better time management or gaining insights into your billable hours.

Using Hours is as fuss-free as installing it onto any iOS device and setting up your first timer. The idea is to create timers for every project or every task, and rearrange them according to priority. Hours then tracks everything in real time. If you need to work on several things in one morning, switching between projects is as simple as tapping the timer.

You can see your worked hours through the beautifully-designed reporting function, and view all of your activity in just one place. This lets you spot trends and allows you to readjust your priorities as needed.

Hours is available for all Apple devices, including the Apple watch.

TopTracker: Best for Tracking Time and Performance

TopTracker is as clean, intuitive, and simple as it comes. Designed specifically for freelancers by freelancers, TopTracker does simple timekeeping while offering features like webcam shots and screenshots of your work in progress.

Simply set up your project and enable (or disable) the features that you like. As soon as you start working, the app ticks and tracks quietly in the background so as not to disrupt your work session. If you're working with a team, you can also get a centralised view of your team's productivity and projects. Simple graphs and other data can be viewed with a simple click.

TopTracker is completely free and available as a web and desktop app.

RescueTime: Best for Improving Personal Productivity

RescueTime has been helping professionals and freelancers stay focused since 2008. Like all the other apps we've covered, RescueTime is great at fulfilling its core function - tracking time. But what makes it different is the kind of information it captures, and how it makes this data usable.

The moment you get it up and running, RescueTime sees which windows you're using, takes down the window name, and tracks how much time you've spent on it. Through a detailed report, you understand exactly which tasks or websites are eating up most of your time. RescueTime also quantifies your progress with a Productivity Score, which automatically categorizes your activities on websites and applications, then scores them. You can customise the goals and activities to suit your needs.

RescueTime is available for free, but a premium upgrade gives you more sophisticated features, like detailed reports and website blocking.
